Three long time Fairview teachers have announced their retirement. Miss Wonetta Bookwalter, Roy Mayberry and C.W. Detrick will retire at the end of this year.

Miss Bookwalter spent 30 of her 40 teaching years here. She has taught English grammar, literature, history, Latin and French. Her plans include sojourns in New England, Florida, the Caribbean and south America, and more time for reading, experimenting with recipes and improving her bridge game.

Mr. Mayberry plans to "do a lot of loafing" in

his new free time. He has spent 40 years at Fairview as a coach, and a teacher of physical education, geography and health. He was awarded the "Dad of the Year" award this year, at the first annual presentation.

Miss Bookwalter and Mr. Mayberry are members of the Quarter Century club at FHS.

Mr. Detrick spent the last 11 of his 35 years at Fairview, teaching math and music. His son and daughter both graduated from FHS. He plans to open a camera repair shop.

Pam Scores In French

Pam Needham, Fairview Senior, won first place in the regional French test given at Fairview. Miss Needham received a 95% to make her the top person in the five state area of Ohio, Michigan, Kentucky, West Virginia and Indiana. The test was divided into four sections each corresponding with the four different grade levels of high school French classes and then these four classes were subdivided into two general categories, one for students who have learned their French main-

ly in the class room and the other for those who have had special help in their language training. The test was sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of French. The test was given in strictest secrecy and not even Mr. Bruggeman, Pam's French teacher, saw the test beforehand. The test itself was broken down into five areas of accomplishment including oral comprehension, dictation, reading, grammar, and history and culture.
