## Luis, Toon Say Good-bye

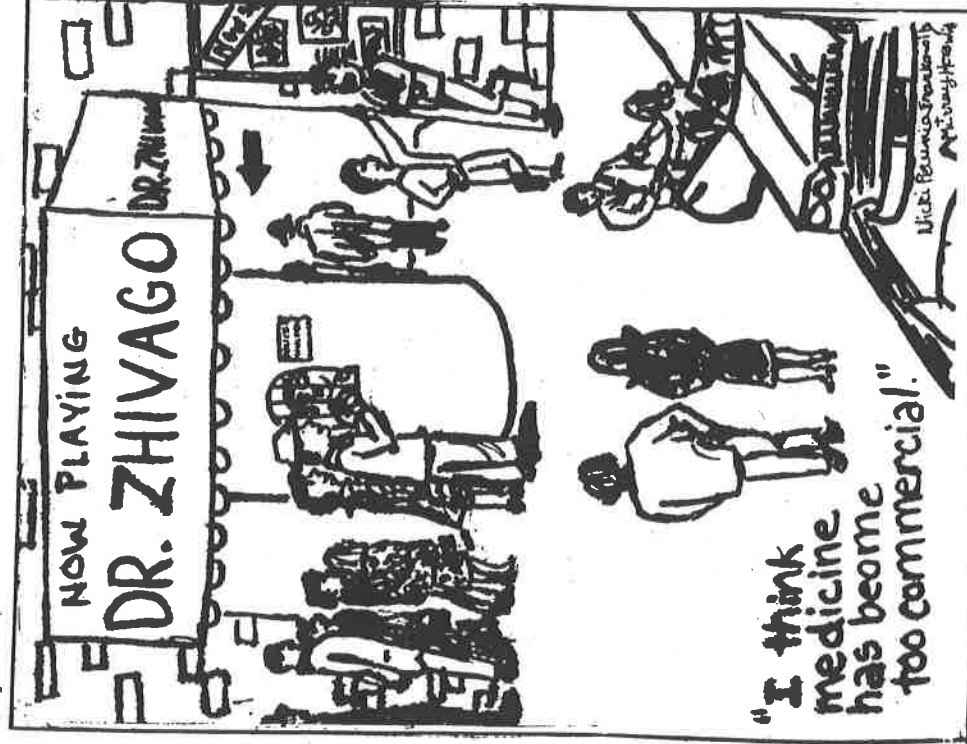
